A Simple Gesture

Put the pickup dates on your calendar.

Drop-off dates for 2024 are:

March 24, April 28, May 19, June 23, July 28, August 25, September 29, October 27, November 17 and December 15.

A recent article in the High Point Enterprise said 2023 was a record year for A Simple Gesture, with 110,835 lbs. of nonperishable food collected by High Point partner organizations, of which First Baptist is a member. The collected food is valued at over \$190,000 and is equivalent to 138,543 child-size meals.
