

Gifts and receipts through 11 months are \$75,000 below last year and that puts us in a very negative position going into December. Maybe we will get a year-end boost in giving.

As you can see, spending is only a little more than last year. Since Sept. 22, 2023, we are leasing from the City of High Point so we will take even more from savings and earnings to meet the bills. Going into 2024 we have cut facility costs to the point that there is no significant other spending cuts to make. We are fortunate enough to have savings to draw from and that's what we will have to do. - Don Myers, treasurer

January Church Conference Agenda

- The Stewardship Committee shall determine if there has accumulated a surplus from unspent budgeted funds for the previous year and, if there is a surplus, the committee shall apportion same to mission projects supported by this Church, the new Church budget, or to programs and special projects and interests of the Church with a specific recommendation to the Church at the January Church Conference, or as soon thereafter as practicable.
- The Nominating Committee shall submit names of 3 non-Deacon members to serve on the Pastoral Relations Committee. There will be a vote to remove Rene Folk from the Personnel Committee (at her request). Pam Myers will take her place.
- The Pastor Relations Committee will propose the following change to the Constitution and Bylaws: In our By-Laws (Amended and Restated July 10, 2013

Oct. 8, 2023), Article IV, Section A, Pastor, paragraph 4, line 5, it states that the pastor shall "... .perform other duties that usually pertain to that office " The Pastor Relations Committee would like to propose a change that reads "... perform other duties as stated in the Senior Minister Job Description and Responsibilities document " This document was created by the Pastor Relations Committee using the Pastor Profile as a guide. The document clearly outlines the job responsibilities and expectations of our Senior Minister. The committee also is working on a pastoral job description and a performance review form that follows the Constitution and Bylaws. In January the group will start using the performance review on Jeff Rogers as practice.
